Nature Notes: We heard, and then saw, our first cuckoo on 23rd. April and a week later observed a pair on the telegraph wires crossing Chris Wilson's field north of Slingsby. Subsequently, we hear them every day, mostly at dusk. It seems we are fortunate to have this summer migrant bird, which parasites nests every year. Declines are reported from elsewhere in Britain, due, it is thought, to declining host species of birds and the lack of moths, as well as problems in their wintering quarters. M.T. 7.5.06 (628620).
