Do you care about the future of your local church? How will ministry continue in the deanery if fewer clergy are available? The Rural Dean and Lay Chairman have sent this notification: 'An extraordinary meeting of the Deanery Synod is to take place on **Wednesday 1 July 2009** at 7.30pm in St Michael's Church, New Malton. There will be only one agenda item. Following the recent distribution of the Discussion Paper on the 2009 Deanery Plan, the Archdeacon will speak to the various possibilities which lie before us. This will be an open meeting and we would ask members of the Deanery Synod to encourage everyone with an interest in this important matter to attend.'

Bringing the library service to you: If you find it difficult to get to a library or a mobile library, we can deliver books for you and / or your family at home – and it's a completely free service! Joining the service is simple – just ring your local library, or the number below. They will arrange for a member of staff to come and visit you to discuss your reading interests e.g. favourite authors, likes and dislikes and then we use that information to choose books especially for you. You can have ordinary print, large print, children's books, and books on CD or cassette – if it's in any library in North Yorkshire, we can get it for you. You can request particular books or authors, and you can keep the books until you finish them without worrying about fees and overdue charges. We have teams of local volunteers who will bring your books every two weeks and take away the ones you have finished with. It's quite nice to see a friendly face too, and you will soon get to know your regular volunteers.
