**Hovingham War Time Evacuees.** A reception was held in Hovingham Village Hall on 1 June, for a party of ex-evacuees, who came to Hovingham from Hartlepool in the troubled times of 1940. They were accompanied by relatives and friends. The party returned to look up the homes in which they stayed and meet as many local people as they could. Many fond memories were shared. It was a memorable and moving occasion for all present. At the conclusion of the proceedings Mrs Sheila Dowson, née Cann, presented a commemorative plaque to the Villagers of Hovingham. The inscription reads: "*Presented to the community of Hovingham from the evacuees past and present of Hartlepool on the 1<sup>st</sup> June, 2006, with grateful thanks for the kindness and care given to us in 1940.*" The plaque is now displayed in the Village Hall main committee room.
